PROVIDING QUALITY HOMES

1,742

Affordable, stable housing was provided to seniors, adults with physical, intellectual or developmental disabilities, and families living in poverty.

SUPPORTING OUR VETERANS

Since the start of the program in June 2015 individuals and veteran families have received the support they need to overcome homelessness and achieve safe, secure permanent housing.

PREVENTING YOUTH SUBSTANCE ABUSE

Middle and high school students successfully completed programs focused on developing their social skills and preventing future drug and alcohol abuse.

People received the help they need to fight additions in our residential and outpatient treatment programs.

ADDRESSING RE-ENTRY NEEDS

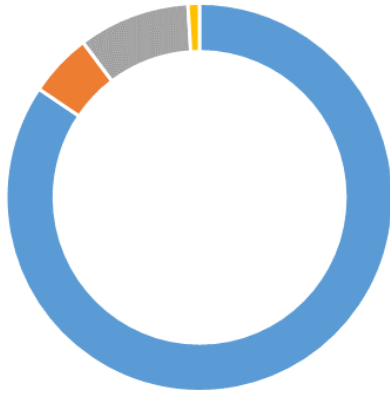

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

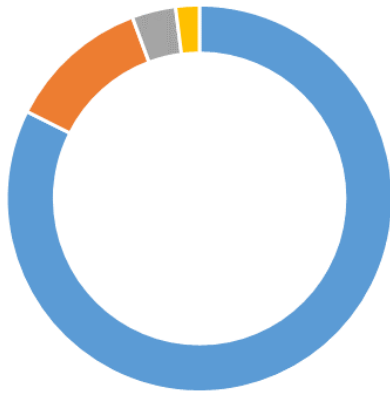
For the year ending June 30, 2015
